On April 15, 2019 the San Luis Valley BOCES received our AU Determination. As a condition of accepting IDEA funds, Administrative Units (San Luis Valley BOCES) is provided an annual report on progress related to how we meet State Performance Plan (SPP) targets. CDE uses the same categories that the United States Department of Education, Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP), uses for making State Determinations.

The first component we will cover is the Compliance Matrix that includes scoring on SPP (State Performance Plan) Compliance Indicators.

### **Compliance Matrix:**

Indicator 4A: Whether the AU has significant discrepancy from the state in the number suspensions/expulsions of students with disabilities for greater than 10 days in a school year. Points Eligible: 2 Points Earned: 2

Indicator 4B: Whether the AU has disproportionate representation by race/ethnicity in the number of suspensions/expulsions of students with disabilities for greater than 10 days in a school year due to inappropriate policies, procedures or practices. Points Eligible: 2 Points Earned: 2

Indicator 9: Whether the Administrative Unit (AU) has disproportionate representation of students with disabilities by race or ethnicity due to inappropriate identification. Points Eligible: 2 Points Earned: 2

Indicator 10: Whether the AU has disproportionate representation of students with disabilities by race or ethnicity in a specific disability category due to inappropriate identification. Points Eligible: 2 Points Earned: 2

Indicator 11: Percent of children for whom an evaluation was completed within 60 calendar days. Points Eligible: 2 Points

Indicator 12: Percent of children referred by Part C prior to age 3, who are found eligible for Part B, and who have an IEP developed and implemented by their third birthday. Points Eligible: 2 Points Earned: 2

Indicator 13: Secondary Transition Points Eligible: 2 Points Earned: 2

Timely and Accurate Data Submission: The timeliness and accuracy of data submitted by the AU's Points Eligible: 2 Points Earned: 2

**Results Determination Score: Needs Assistance** 

The final step taken is to combine our Compliance Determination (score) with our Results Determination (score) to create a final Determination for the San Luis Valley BOCES. The results are: Compliance Score- 100 out of 100

• Compliance Determination = Meets Requirement X 50% (percentage of overall final determination score)

Results Score- 157.8 out of 300

• Results Determination= Needs Assistance x 50% (percentage of overall final determination score)

Total San Luis Valley percentage is 76.3%, which puts us in the overall final determination of **MEETS REGUIREMENTS.** 

This is very complicated but useful information. We continue to be good at compliance so kudos to us all. What we have to make sure we increase is the results for students with disabilities such as graduation rates, state assessment outcomes and growth, and preschool achievement and growth outcomes.
